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TIPS FOR USING THIS OUTLINE

Do: - ✓ Fill in as much detail as possible before drafting - ✓ Revise outline as you discover new ideas while writing - ✓ Keep outline nearby while drafting each chapter - ✓ Use outline to maintain focus when writing - ✓ Add notes as you remember new details

Don't: - ✗ Feel locked into the outline (it's a guide, not a prison) - ✗ Skip chapters you're excited about to follow order - ✗ Expect every detail to appear in final draft - ✗ Forget to connect chapters thematically - ✗ Ignore patterns that emerge as you plan

Remember: - Your outline will evolve as you write - Some chapters may expand or contract - New chapters may emerge - Some planned chapters may be cut or combined - The outline prevents writer's block by giving you direction

TROUBLESHOOTING

If a chapter feels weak: - Is the central focus clear? - Does it connect to overall theme? - Are there enough specific details? - Does it show change or development?

If chapters don't connect: - Review transitions between chapters - Identify thematic threads that tie them together - Add bridging material - Ensure chronological clarity (if relevant)

If you're stuck on a chapter: - Skip it and write another chapter first - Interview family members for details - Revisit photos/documents from that period - Free-write about the period without structure - Focus on one scene and expand from there

If chapters are unbalanced: - Combine short chapters with similar themes - Split long chapters at natural break points - Expand underdeveloped chapters with reflection - Cut less important events from overstuffed chapters

FINAL NOTE

Your outline is complete when: - All planned chapters have detailed entries - Thematic connections are clear - Narrative arc is mapped beginning to end - Essential scenes are distributed throughout - You feel confident about what each chapter will contain - You're excited to start writing
