First paragraph begins here with 0.5 inch indentation. The entire paper is double-spaced with 1-inch margins on all sides. Use 12-point Times New Roman font. According to recent research, this approach is effective (Smith, 2023). Direct quotes require page numbers (Smith, 2023, p. 45).

Second paragraph continues with the same formatting. Each paragraph is indented 0.5 inch. Multiple authors are cited with an ampersand (Smith & Jones, 2023). Three or more authors use et al. (Smith et al., 2023).

Heading Level 1: Centered, Bold, Title Case

Text continues after heading. Level 1 headings are used for major sections like Method, Results, and Discussion.

Heading Level 2: Left-Aligned, Bold, Title Case

Text continues after level 2 heading. These are subsections within major sections.

Second paragraph continues with proper indentation. Multiple authors use "and" in citations (Smith and Jones 23). Three or more authors use et al. (Williams et al. 67). All borrowed ideas must be cited properly.

Optional Heading: Centered or Left-Aligned

Text continues after heading. MLA does not require specific heading formats, but headings should be consistent throughout the paper. Headings are optional unless required by instructor.

Block quotations are used for quotes of four or more lines. Recent research indicates:

This is a block quotation that is four or more lines long and is therefore indented 0.5 inch from the left margin. Block quotes are double-spaced and do not use quotation marks. The citation appears after the final punctuation. (Smith 123)

Regular text continues after the block quote with normal paragraph indentation.

Common Mistakes

APA Mistakes

Method

Participants

The study included 200 undergraduate students from a large public university. Participants ranged in age from 18 to 22 years ($M = 19.5$, $SD = 1.2$). All participants provided informed consent before participating in the study.

Materials

The study used a standardized assessment tool developed by Brown (2022). The assessment consisted of 50 multiple-choice questions measuring student comprehension and engagement.

Procedure

Participants completed the assessment in a controlled laboratory setting. Each session lasted approximately 45 minutes. Data were collected over a 3-week period in October 2024.

Literature Review

Previous research has explored various aspects of technology integration in educational settings. Brown emphasizes the importance of proper implementation, arguing that "technology alone does not guarantee success" (67). Williams et al. support this position, noting that teacher training is essential for effective technology use in classrooms (89).

Multiple studies have examined student engagement with educational technology. Recent findings suggest that interactive platforms increase participation (Johnson 112). However, Davis cautions that excessive screen time may have negative effects on attention spans (34).
