NOT missing hanging indent on entries	
NOT wrong alphabetical order	
NOT extra spaces between entries	
NOT wrong author format (should be Last, First)	
NOT including "Retrieved from" (unless no date)

Verification Questions

Ask yourself before submitting:

1. Does my paper have a header with my last name and page number on EVERY page?

prose - 3+ lines = Block quote for poetry - Double-space = Everything in entire paper

- 2. Did I use a heading (not a title page) on the first page?3. Is my entire paper double-spaced with no extra spaces anywhere?
- 4. Are all paragraphs indented 0.5 inch?
- 5. Did I cite every borrowed idea, quote, and paraphrase?
- 6. Does every in-text citation have a matching Works Cited entry?
- 7. Is my Works Cited page alphabetized with hanging indents?
 8. Did I use "and" (not "&") in my citations?
 9. Did I avoid using "p." or "pp." in my citations?
 10. Is my date in Day Month Year format?

If you answered YES to all 10 questions, your MLA formatting is correct!
