Tier 1: Content Revision

1. Consistency of Categories

- o Each category follows the same organizing principle.

2. Balance Across Categories

- o Categories are proportionate in detail and length.
- o No category dominates or is underdeveloped.

3. Distinctness of Categories

4. Relevance of Examples

- o Each example supports the category clearly.
- Avoid irrelevant or weak examples.

5. Accuracy and Validity

- o Verify factual accuracy for research-based examples.
- o Ensure examples are representative of the category.

Tier 2: Structural Revision

Check that your essay flows logically, transitions are smooth, and the structure aligns with your thesis.

1. Thesis-Body Alignment

- o The thesis statement clearly states categories and organizing principle.
- o Each body paragraph reflects a category mentioned in the thesis.

2. Paragraph Order

- o Categories are presented in a logical or strategic order.
- o Consider order for **contrast**, **importance**, **or progression**.

3. Topic Sentences

o Each paragraph begins with a clear topic sentence identifying the category.

4. Transitions Between Paragraphs

- Use transitional phrases to link categories smoothly.
- Avoid abrupt shifts between paragraphs.

5. Introduction and Conclusion

- o Introduction sets up the organizing principle and categories.
- o Conclusion summarizes categories and insights.

Tier 3: Style Revision

Focus on language, sentence structure, word choice, and grammatical correctness.

1. Sentence Variety

- o Mix short and long sentences for rhythm and readability.
- o Avoid repetitive sentence structures.

2. Word Choice and Clarity

- o Use precise, specific language for categories and examples.
- o Avoid vague or overly general terms.

3. Grammar, Punctuation, and Mechanics

- o Check for subject-verb agreement, tense consistency, and punctuation errors.
- o Remove unnecessary words and redundancies.

4. Consistency in Tone

- o Maintain formal academic tone throughout the essay.
- o Avoid slang, casual language, or abrupt changes in voice.
