

# Compare & Contrast Essay: Topic Evaluation Checklist

Use this checklist to evaluate whether your chosen topic meets all essential requirements for a strong compare and contrast essay.

## 1. Same Category Requirement

Both subjects belong to the same logical category or serve similar functions.
