- Mixed aromas
- What they evoke

Textures & Touch:

- Surface qualities
- Temperature
- Physical sensations

Taste (if relevant):

- Food/drink associated with place
- Air quality

V. ATMOSPHERE & MOOD

Emotional Quality:

- Overall feeling/vibe
- Energy level (busy, calm, tense)

• Psychological impact

Time & Season:

- Time of day described
- Seasonal influences
- How time affects the place

Weather & Climate:

- Current conditions
- Typical weather patterns
- Environmental effects

VI. ACTIVITY & MOVEMENT

People (if present):

- Who frequents this place
- What they do
- Interactions and behaviors

Motion & Flow:

- Traffic patterns
- Natural movement (wind, water)
- Rhythm of activity

Purpose & Function:

- What happens here
- Why people come
- Role in community

VII. DETAILS & SPECIFICS

Small Observations:

- Overlooked details
- Quirky elements
- Personal discoveries

Changes Over Time:

- Signs of age/wear
- Seasonal changes
- Historical layers

Unique Characteristics:

- What makes it different
- Signature features
- Hidden aspects

- Left to right
- Top to bottom
- Near to far

- Center outward
- Most to least important feature

WRITING TIPS

- Use precise, concrete nouns over vague adjectives
- Include specific measurements when helpful
- Show time passing through changing details
- Compare to familiar places when useful
- Balance description with atmosphere
- End with memorable snapshot or reflection
