UCAS 2026 SUBMISSION CHECKLIST

Content Checklist:

- **Q1** focuses on **academic** motivation, not general interest
- **Q2** includes **specific examples** with skills/learning articulated
- **Q3** mentions **university-specific** details (not generic praise)
- Overall tone is **professional and academically mature**
- **No** irrelevant extracurriculars (unless they demonstrate relevant skills)
- **No** quotes, gimmicks, or childhood anecdotes
- **No** negative comments about current education

Technical Checklist:

- **Total character count** ≤ **4,000** (including spaces)
- **Spell-checked** (UK English for UK applications)
- **Course name(s) correct** for each university choice
- **No formatting** (bold, italics, underlines) – UCAS text box will strip it
- **Paragraphs separated** by blank lines
- **Proofread aloud** for flow and errors
- **Saved in a plain text editor** (Notepad, TextEdit) before final copy-paste

Final Validation Questions:

- If you removed your name, could this **only** describe you?
- Does it sound like someone **ready for independent study**?
- Would a subject lecturer find it **convincing and specific**?
- Does it **answer why this subject, why you, and why this university**?

CHARACTER COUNT VERIFICATION STEPS

1. **Draft** in Word/Google Docs
2. **Paste** final version into: <https://www.charactercountonline.com/>
3. **Adjust** sections using the allocator targets above
4. **Final paste** into plain text editor, then into UCAS

Template Tip: The 2026 UCAS statement is an **academic proposition**. Every sentence should demonstrate your suitability for rigorous study in your chosen field. Show, don't just tell, your academic readiness.
