
Remote Work Readiness Checklist

A Practical Self-Assessment for College Students

How to Use This Checklist

This checklist helps you evaluate whether you are ready for **remote internships or entry-level remote roles**.

Tick each box honestly. The goal is awareness, not perfection.

1. Asynchronous Communication Readiness

- I write messages that include full context, not just updates
- My messages clearly state progress, blockers, and next steps
- I rarely need to send follow-up clarifications after posting updates
- I use professional tone in emails, chat, and shared documents
- I can explain problems clearly without real-time conversation

2. Self-Directed Time Management

- I meet deadlines without reminders or supervision
- I break large tasks into smaller, trackable steps
- I estimate how long tasks will take realistically
- I communicate early if a deadline might slip
- I stay productive without external structure

3. Digital Collaboration Tool Readiness

- I have used Slack or Teams for structured work communication
- I have used a project board (Trello, Asana, or similar)
- I collaborate on shared documents with comments and version control
- I know when to switch from text to video for clarity
- I keep shared work organized and easy for others to follow

4. Independent Problem-Solving

- I try multiple solutions before asking for help
- I research issues independently using reliable sources

- I document solutions for future reference
- I escalate problems clearly and with evidence
- I take ownership instead of waiting for instructions

5. Results Orientation

- I focus on completed deliverables, not hours worked
- I can show finished projects or outcomes
- I track my progress and results
- I can explain what impact my work had
- I finish tasks without needing frequent check-ins

7. Your Remote Work Readiness Score

- Simulate remote work conditions intentionally
